- October 30 - 31, 2023
- Chicago, IL, USA
- 98 sprinters (83 in person and 13 virtual), 50% new sprinters
- Work done on 10 projects over 2 days
- Projects continue between Sprints
- 2 new Best Practice Groups:
  - Deployment
  - Nonprofit Cloud



## ▶ Live Projects

- ▶ [Declarative Lookup Rollup Summaries \(DLRS\)](#) - interface to rollup data between records where Salesforce can't do it natively
- ▶ [Salesforce Indicators](#) - Visually highlight important data at a glance
- ▶ [Summit Events App \(SEA\)](#) - Events management for paid, free, group, guests, and individual attendee events

## ▶ In Development Projects

- ▶ Membership Done Better (live Winter 2024) - common data model and support automations for managing memberships in Salesforce
- ▶ AI Prompts for Nonprofits - making AI tools like ChatGPT easier to use for nonprofits
- ▶ Grants Content Kit - stores and organizes grant proposal content in Salesforce

- ▶ I watched the release webinar, now what? - Sandi Nuss Zellner
  - ▶ CREATE
    - ▶ Calendar - Know when changes are happening; block your calendar to give time for learning and testing
    - ▶ Research - Learn the details of what is coming and how it could impact your org (positively and negatively)
    - ▶ Experiment - Main sandbox on same version as PROD; build, test, and deploy
    - ▶ Align - Prioritize features with business value; find quick wins; make a release plan; define roles and responsibilities for the whole team (not just the Salesforce team)
    - ▶ Tell - Keep your team informed of changes and important dates
    - ▶ Enhance - Complete a readiness release retrospective so you know what worked, what didn't, and what to do next time



- ▶ Cracking the Code: Introducing SOQL for #AwesomeAdmins - Mark Jones
  - ▶ Query and extract data for reports, dashboards, and automation workflows
  - ▶ Pros- no report types; can sort up to 4 fields; can limit number of records
  - ▶ Great for ad hoc reporting
  - ▶ Basic Syntax:
    - ▶ Select <select\_list> - field(s)
    - ▶ FROM <Object\_API\_Name> - object(s)
    - ▶ WHERE [Add clause]
    - ▶ GROUP BY [Add clause]
    - ▶ ORDER BY [Add clause] -sort
    - ▶ LIMIT BY [Add clause] - number of records you want to see
- ▶ [LWC SOQL Builder](#) - free tool that allows you to download SOQL queries as a CSV



- ▶ Admin's Guide to Crafting Effective Scenarios for Salesforce Testing Success - Cassie Supilowski
  - ▶ Shift Left - The cost to fix an issue gets progressively higher the later you solve it.
  - ▶ Testing can help users understand the complexity of their request
    - ▶ Your estimate should be configuration hours + testing hours
  - ▶ Testing includes:
    - ▶ Positive testing - what you want to have happen actually happens
    - ▶ Negative testing - what should not happen doesn't happen
    - ▶ Edge cases - testing the thing you assume no user will do
  - ▶ Be a tester, not a checker - think creatively about how people are using your system and test from that knowledge base



# Nonprofit Cloud (NPC) Updates

- ▶ Salesforce team expectation: not everyone is going to move to Nonprofit Cloud
  - ▶ There are 54K nonprofits registered through the Power of Us
- ▶ At the same time, no new NPSP updates expected in Salesforce Releases
  - ▶ Community Commons Sprint projects fill some of that gap
- ▶ Migration should be a choice based on your organization's needs
  - ▶ Need to look at what you want to do, data models, and licensing
- ▶ More information and support about NPC are planned now
  - ▶ Enablement and sharing sessions mid-December (Trailhead community)
  - ▶ 2024 focus is on migration for those who are interested
    - ▶ NPSP-to-NPC Migration Pilot Project
    - ▶ NPSP-to-NPC Migration Toolkit launch
    - ▶ Partner Migration Services support
